

Instructions for installing a new Net World Tennis Net

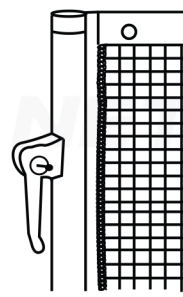


Fig 1: External Winder

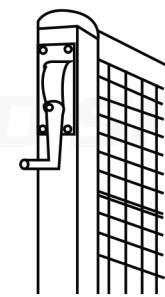


Fig 2: Internal Winder

Step 1: Assess the type of tennis posts you have. Using Fig 1 and Fig 2 ascertain if the posts have an Internal or External Winder.

Step 2: If they have an Internal Winder (Fig 2), use a pair of snips to cut cable down by 2' 5". This gives the correct length cable and a plain pin finish.

Step 3: Hook the net onto the Anchor Post (Fig 3) and feed cable over the top of the post so that the cable is sitting in the groove.

Step 4: At the other end of the net, hook or feed the cable into the winder mechanism (Fig 4). Then tension cable using winder handle till taut.

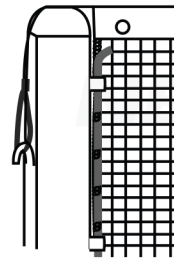


Fig 5: Retaining Rod

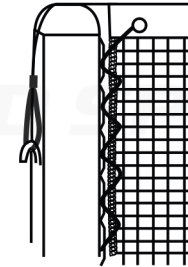


Fig 7: Fixed Lacing Bar

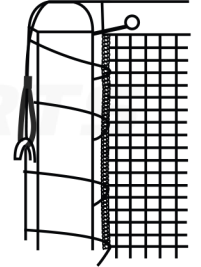


Fig 8: Twine/Rope Lacing

Step 5: Lace net to the vertical side of posts, using appropriate method (Fig 5, 6, 7, 8).

Finishing Touches

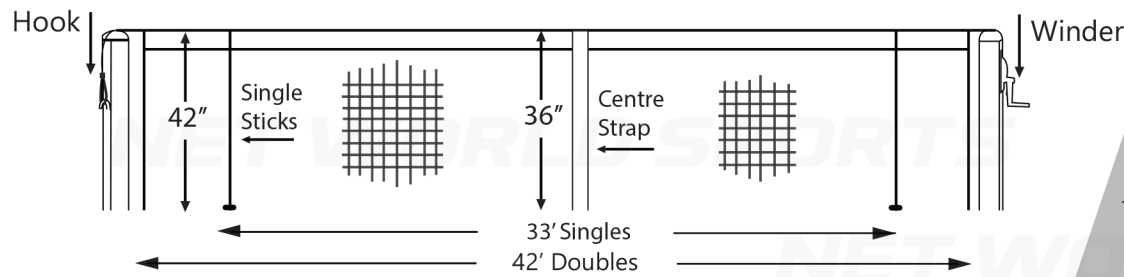


Fig 9: Tennis Net Dimensions

- Use a Net World Centre Strap to reduce the middle net height to 3' (Fig 9).
- If you are playing singles and using a standard 42' Doubles Net, use Net World Aluminium Singles Sticks. Locate these 4' 6" in from either post.

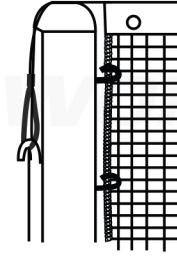


Fig 6: Hooks

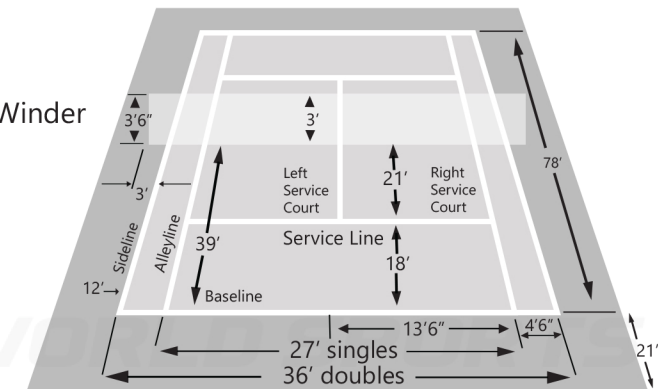


Fig 10: Tennis Court Dimensions
